Description	Finding 9. Practical exercises and testing in RWP classes are not standardized, which could lead to workers getting Level II or Level IV certification without proper instruction. 2. Metrorail must develop and use a detailed instructor's guide listing all practical exercises and steps for those practical exercises to ensure consistency and accuracy. The guide must specify skills students must demonstrate to pass each class. The risk level of C0046 is rated at 2C - Undesirable Management Decision. This unannounced Inspection was predicated on a briefing to relevant Metrorail Management. The briefing occurred on Wednesday August 23, 2023, during the out-briefing phase of another inspection conducted by the WMSC that day. The information conveyed was the fact that the WMSC will be conducting future inspections at CTF related to Roadway Worker Protection (RWP). METHOD: The Inspection was performed by two WMSC Inspectors and took place by surveying via questioning several RWP Instructors. Components of the inspection comprised of the listed parts: - Questioning about the presence and use of an instructor guide - (Instructors were asked if they were using the document in the RWP Level 2 and Level 4 classes.) - Review of completed supervisor compliance checks for the use of the TSMT required Instructor Guide for calendar year 2023. DATA: (Two Findings.) 1.) Three out of three RWP Instructors answered no to the use of an instructor's guide. However, One RWP Instructor was aware of it being located on the departmental computer K drive but admits to not using it during classroom instruction. 2.) Completed Supervisory compliance checks ensuring the use of the required Instructors guide did not exist. CONCLUSION: Upon completion of the inspection, the WMSC Inspectors briefed Metrorail management staff concerning the details of the unannounced inspection. The findings discussed included identified gaps and practical drift away from the mandated parts of C0046 and how corrections can be achieved.
