A copy of the MOR was also present in the C99 Yard Tower. Upon inspection of the document, it was found that it had not been updated via General Order No. 101. Per Metrorail, "General Order No. 101 mandates the incorporation of all Permanent Orders issued before December 31, 2023, with an effective date on or before March 1, 2024, into the Metrorail Operating Rulebook." Correct Action Plan C-0193 required the following," Finding: With frequent modifications due to temporary and permanent orders, and outdated versions of Metrorail's rulebook being distributed to personnel when hard copies are available, the latest Metrorail rules are not easily accessible to train operators. 
